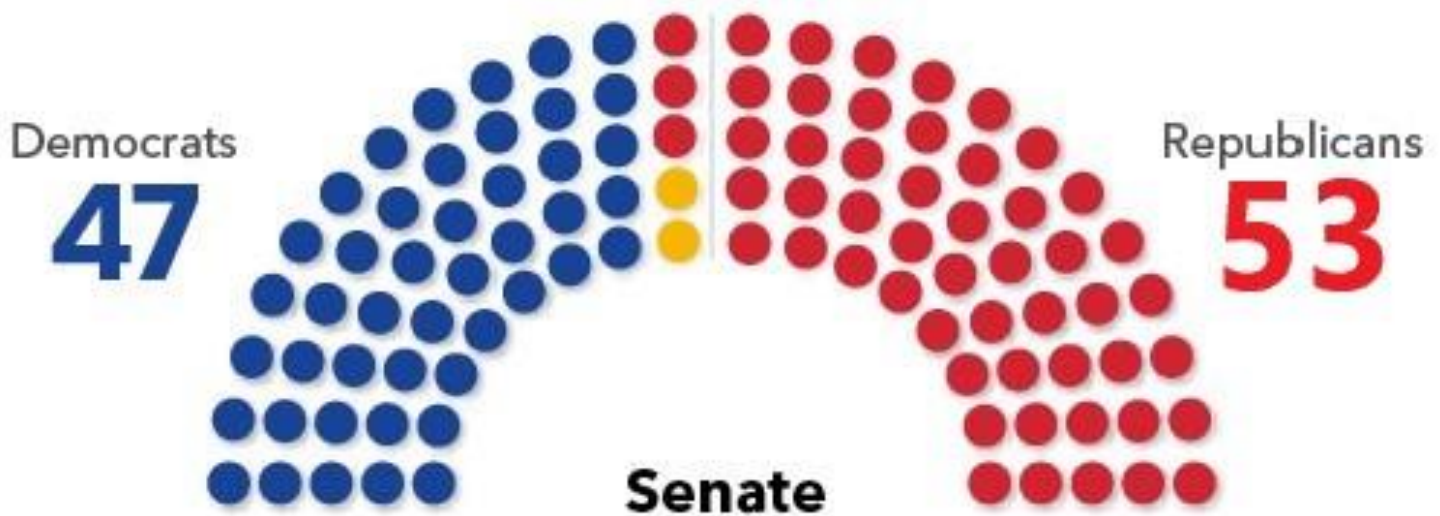

Senate Leadership

Republicans have maintained majority control in the U.S. Senate, picking up 2 additional seats. As a party, Senate Republicans have a self-imposed term limit of six years for leadership positions, which is not imposed on the position of party leader. Republican Senate Whip John Cornyn (TX) has been term limited out of his former leadership while others have moved up in leadership. In the Senate Democratic Caucus, all the current Senators in leadership positions are returning for the 116th Congress.

Republicans will hold a majority of seats in the chamber for the 116th Congress. The Senate committees with primary jurisdiction in health issues are the Senate Finance Committee (Medicare, Medicaid, Affordable Care Act) and the Senate Health, Education, Labor and Pensions (HELP) Committee (FDA, NIH, CDC, public health, Affordable Care Act).

*Joint committees are made up of bicameral members. The chairmanship and vice-chairmanship of the committee alternate between the Senate and House each Congress.

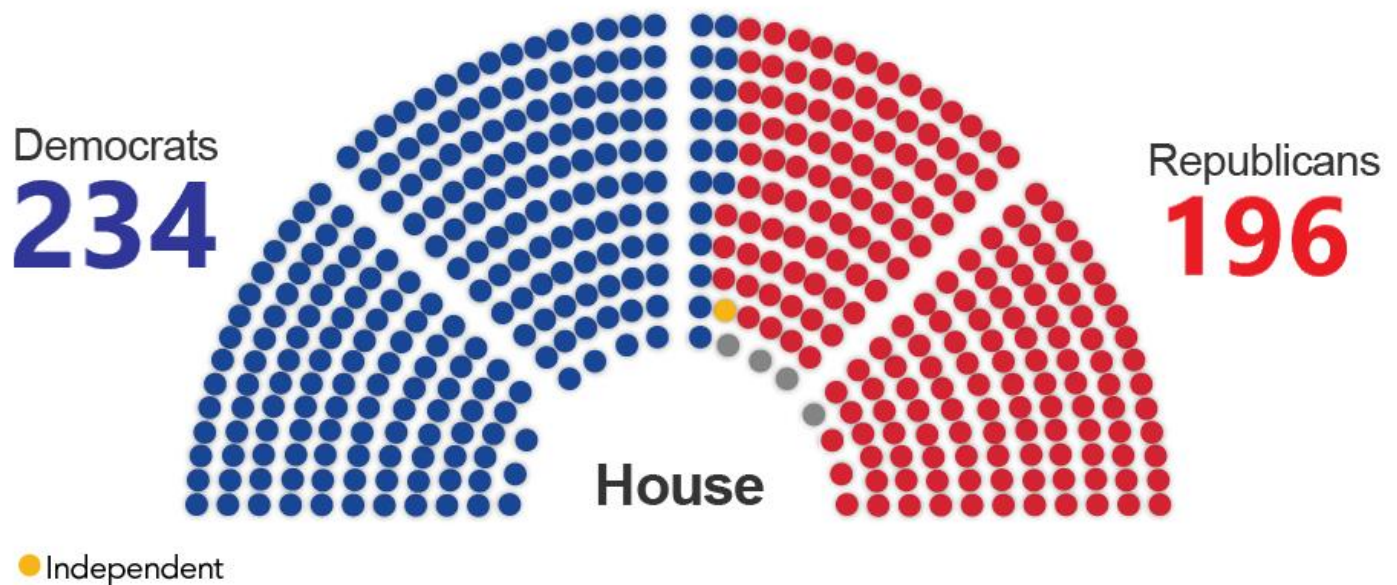
